



I have now been at Bethel with you for a year and a half. I am enjoying it here and it seems like a good fit. Robin and I feel like we have been welcomed into this congregation. After eighteen months it is a good time to take stock as to how things are going. We will have a Church Conference on January 26 to approve the budget and hear reports from the various groups within the church. Each year at these gatherings the pastor is expected to give a State of the Church Report. This note is a preview of that.

While we may not be huge in numbers we do have a huge heart at Bethel Church. We have a lot of people who pitch in to accomplish our activities. There is a deep concern for our world and particularly people around us in need or who are hurting. During our prayer time in worship the joys and the concerns flow freely. This connects us to each other and to people outside our walls.

I am impressed by the dedication that people have to living their faith and growing spiritually. Throughout the year we host both a mid-week Bible study and a book study that are well attended. There is also a strong commitment to missions in the congregation. We have people who regularly serve meals at Simpson Shelter and a group who pack meals at Feed My Starving Children every other week. Then there are the Wednesday meals that are served to our own community in collaboration with the Free Church across the street. Every other week the meal is in our Fellowship Hall and put on by our members. The number of people we have engaged in these and other mission activities amounts to a significant part of our congregation.

As we begin this New Year there are several projects that we are considering to improve and update our church. One is to make the visuals in the sanctuary permanent with a mounted screen and projector system. Our sign on Commerce Blvd. has had problems and is showing much wear. An electronic sign would give a more modern appearance and would be far easier to change its message. We would like to update our computer software that we use for our church records so that it would all be integrated instead of pieced together with several programs. Finally there are some updates we are looking at in the narthex to finish some of the renovation that was done a couple of years ago and make the entryway more appealing to the eye. You will be hearing more about these in the coming months, as we will likely need to raise additional funds to make them happen.

This will be an exciting year with a lot of possibility and potential. It is a great time to be in ministry together!

Metro West Builders

Each spring and fall, the Board of Directors of the Metro West Builders reviews applications and selects one project to be the recipient of our Call Grant. This year the 2013 Fall Call Grant is in support of Simpson United Methodist Church of Minneapolis.

Simpson has a long history of ministry and service to it's neighborhood. Currently, the building houses a men's shelter, a women's shelter, a food shelf, the Simpson Center for Servant ministries, and a worshipping congregation. Hundreds of families are served by the food shelf, and 66 men and women are sheltered every night in the building.

The building that houses these ministries is in serious need of repairs to the stucco. Cracks are causing damage to inner walls and ceilings. The total cost for repair of the stucco comes to \$22,000. An anonymous donor has stepped forward to match your gift, dollar for dollar up to \$10,000. Be a partner in their ministry.
