#### **Construction Zone**

It appears that our loooong winter season is *finally* coming to a close. We are starting to see some warmer weather as we look forward to the month of May. It is very welcomed. The sunshine and warmth put smiles on people's faces. It makes it easier to get out and get around. We've all heard the old joke about Minnesota weather, though. We only have two seasons: winter and road construction. So, now that winter is fading away it is time to see the signs indicating that roadwork is being done.

In preparation for that our sermons for the next several weeks will put us in a "Construction Zone." Throughout the Easter season, beginning with the Sunday following Easter, our sermons will focus on the first letter of Peter. The author speaks with the heart of a pastor to Christians who are struggling on multiple levels. Many of them are physically persecuted and having conflict with the surrounding culture as a result of their faith. The author writes to encourage them and to build up their faith by telling them what a gift it is. He writes to help shape and form them as followers of Jesus Christ.

Even though we do not have the same experience as they do, even though we do not share their struggles, we can learn from them what it means to live in faith. We can have our faith built up. Being a Christian does not happen automatically. It takes work, practice, and being formed. That's what this letter is trying to do for the early church and what it can do for us as well. May this be a time for us to enter the "Construction Zone" to have our faith developed and nourished.

I have received a couple of responses to the invitation to submit questions that will form our summer worship themes. We have had paper in the bulletins recently that have started with the words, "Am I the only one who has wondered..." Feel free to fill that in and drop it in the offering plate, leave it in the office or give it to me personally. Anything that you may be wondering about faith, the church, the Bible, or a spiritual matter is good. If you are wondering it is likely that there are others wondering too. You do not have to include your name. It is useful to me to know who is asking in case I need to get clarification on the question so that I address it as completely as possible. You have until May 10 to submit questions and then I will begin planning the series.

At the end of the month will be our Annual conference session. Our construction there will be packing meals for Feed My Starving Children. The Minnesota Annual Conference has set a goal for United Methodists in the state to pack a million meals. That is a great endeavor and a very worthy cause. At the Conference session it is always great to see old friends, to worship together, and to celebrate what United Methodists are doing throughout the state. Even though the time there goes by very quickly, it is a great way to renew spirits.

#### Dinner is Served!

Many of you already know that Bethel and the Free Church have teamed up to serve a free meal to people in the community on Wednesday evenings. The meal is served at the Free Church the first and 3rd Wednesdays, and at Bethel on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays from 5:00-6:30 pm. We have had about 8-12 guests during the cold months and 20-30 guests during the warmer months. It is hard to believe that we have been doing this for almost a year.

Just recently we have had some exciting developments regarding a partnership with the food shelf. In March the food shelf replaced their freezer and gave their old freezer to Bethel. Also, the food shelf has been overwhelmed with donations from Lunds and Jubilee that are over the "sell by date". The food shelf is donating some of their excess food to Bethel and the Free Church to be used for the Wednesday meals or distributed to our guests on Wednesdays. We are now picking up excess bread on Fridays (which we freeze until Wednesday) and bread and/or other perishables on Wednesdays. What a blessing!

You can volunteer by assisting in the kitchen with prep, serve and/or clean-up; or by taking full-charge of a meal with your family or a team that you have organized. We have had many volunteers and teams that have made this mission possible -- thank you!


